1949 Winter Shows To Be Held February 21-25

The 39th annual Red River Valley Winter Shows and Northwest School Farmers' and Homemakers' Week will be held in Crookston February 21-25, inclusive.

Plans are now complete for the livestock, crops, and poultry shows. Indications at present point to outstanding shows in all departments. The state contest for the Pillsbury Wheat Award, for the best spring and durum wheat exhibits, will be held in connection with the crops show. The Junior and Senior Heifer Calf Futurity will again be featured in the livestock show with more than fifty calves on exhibition. Rabbits have been included in the poultry show classification this year.

Meetings will be held during the week for men, women, and 4-H club members, with three evening meetings during the week. Judging contests in livestock and crops will be the feature attraction on Monday, February 21. Crops men and garden club members have meetings on Tuesday, February 22; women's meetings will be held on February 23, 24, and 25; livestock men have their meetings on February 23, and potato men on February 24. 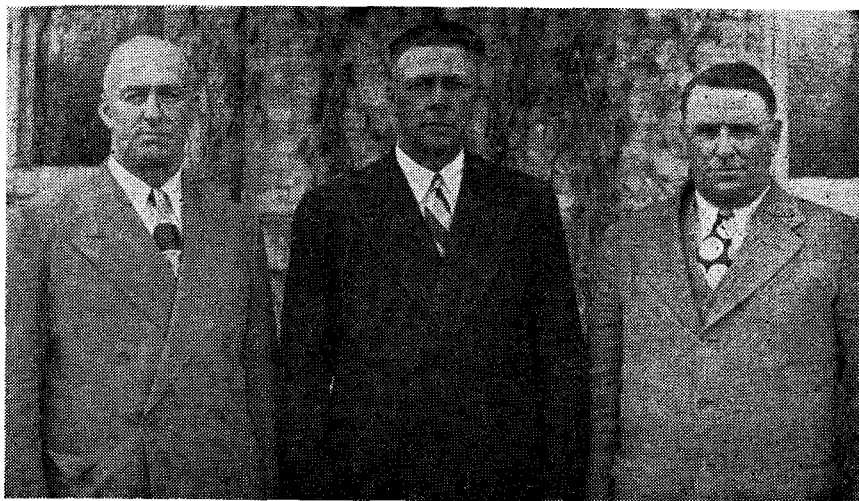
Large Attendance At Homecoming; Queen Elected

Homecoming festivities at the Northwest School started on Friday evening with a torchlight procession, bonfire and "pep fest" under the leadership of 'The Pepsters, the girls' cheer leaders for the school. Students to Present Pan- American Review Of 1948

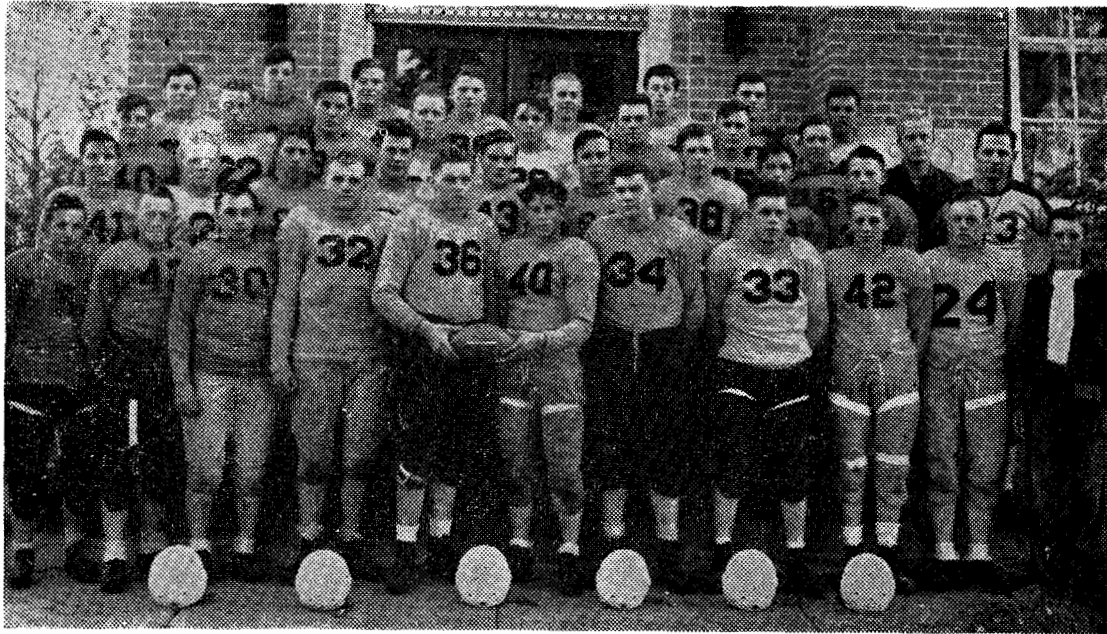

Good Response To Memorial Fund Drive

Northwest School alumni, former students, former faculty members, and friends of the Northwest School have made a splendid response to the World War II Memorial Fund, according to Dr. Kenneth Albertson, chairman of the Memorial Committee. Dr. Albertson reports that 426 contributors have sent in \$688.50 which assures a memorial plaque and a start on the fund for a memorial electric organ.

Former graduating classes are being asked to contribute unexpended class balances to the memorial organ fund. Members of the music staff and students in music at the school are staging the Pan-American Review on December 2 to donate the proceeds of this program to the organ fund. An excellent start on the organ fund will have been made this fall with some \$1400 to \$1600 left to be raised.

Dr. Albertson reports that five to ten cents exchange is being charged on many of the contributors' checks which materially reduces the net amount of the fund.
